## Waterford: Antimicrobial Guidelines - Antimicrobial Guideline: Pancreatitis

## **General points**

The use of antimicrobials to prevent infection in patients with acute pancreatitis, regardless of disease severity or type (interstitial or necrotizing), is generally not recommended.

Antimicrobials are indicated in patients suspected of developing <u>infected necrosis</u>. This occurs in about 30% of patients with pancreatic necrosis, typically 7-10 days after initial presentation. See Hospital-Acquired Intra-Abdominal Infections guideline for treatment options.
