## Waterford: Antimicrobial Guidelines - Antimicrobial Guideline: Timing of Prophylaxis

## **Timing of Prophylaxis**

- The antimicrobial agent should be administered within 60 minutes before surgical incision. <sup>2,4,6</sup>
- Some agents such as ciprofloxacin and vancomycin require longer administration time and should begin within 120 minutes before surgical incision.
- The aim of prophylaxis is to have maximum tissue antibiotic levels at the time of first incision. A single preoperative dose of antibiotic is as effective for majority of procedures. <sup>2,5,6</sup>
- Additional intra-operative dose may be required for:
  - a procedure longer than 4 hours or
  - Intra-operative major blood loss > 1.5 litres (Re-dose following fluid replacement).
- Patients who have suspected or documented infection at the time of surgery or within 48 hours post-operatively requires treatment course and not
  prophylaxis.

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
